CSU – GE Policy and Information

- CSU GE Plan courses must be completed with a passing grade. At Pierce, this is a grade of A, B, C, D or P. **However, areas A1, A2, A3 and B4, must be completed with a C- (2.0) or better for admissions to a CSU campus.**
- Courses may be used only once to satisfy one CSU subject area, even if they are listed in the course agreement under more than one subject area. Courses may be used to satisfy both CSU and major requirements.
 - **Warning:** Many students attend multiple California Community College campuses. Be sure to follow the CSU GE at each college of attendance. CSU GE policy states that CSU GE coursework completed in a specific subject area will be used in the area designated by the California Community College at which the course was completed. This is also the policy if you complete courses at more than one of the LACCD campuses. You must follow the CSU GE of each college you attend.
