**Not part of CSU, but may be completed prior to transfer.** For CSU GE certification purposes, courses used to satisfy this CSU graduation requirement may also be used to satisfy CSU GE Plan Subject Area D. However, if a course(s) is used to satisfy both an CSU GE subject-area requirement and the CSU United States History, Constitution and American Ideals graduation requirement, some CSU campuses may require students to take an additional course(s) after transfer. CSUN will NOT require an additional course(s). Other CSU campuses should be consulted directly regarding their policy.

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**\*CSUN's Comparative Cultures Graduation Requirement (May be completed at Pierce College)**

Students who are fully CSU GE Certified from Pierce College are required to complete 3 units to fulfill this requirement. Students who are not CSU GE Certified, such as most Engineering and Computer Science majors, will need to complete 6 units to fulfill this requirement. **CSU – GE Policy and Information**

- CSU GE Plan courses must be completed with a passing grade. At Pierce, this is a grade of A, B, C, D or P. **However, areas A1, A2, A3 and B4, must be completed with a C (2.0) or better.**
- Courses may be used only once to satisfy one CSU subject area, even if they are listed in the course agreement under more than one subject area. Courses may be used to satisfy both CSU and major requirements.
  - **Warning:** Many students attend multiple California Community College campuses. If that's you, be sure to follow the CSUGE at each college of attendance. CSU policy states that CSU coursework completed in a specific subject area will be used in the area designated by the California Community College at which the course was completed. This is also the policy if you complete courses at more than one of the LACCD colleges. You must follow the CSUGE of each campus you attend.
